## Did you know, if you miss school...

- You may not achieve good exam results which could limit your future career prospects.
  - Your parents / carers could be prosecuted this includes a £120 Penalty Notice, fine of up to £2,500 and / or imprisonment for up to 3 months.
- You are missing out on learning and making progress in your lessons.

You will miss your friends and the social side of school.

The law changed on 1 September 2013 which means that you will not be allowed days off during term-time. Staying off school for things such as holidays or birthdays are unauthorised absences.

If your attendance falls below 90%, attendance

officers will talk to you to find out why you are not

attending school. You may be asked to make up the lesson time in your own time.

- 90% attendance is the equivalent of having half a day off every week.
- 90% attendance over the school year will equate to 4 whole weeks of lessons missed that could be the difference between a pass or fail!
